

Funds Available For Education In New Jersey

TRENTON — In addition to more than \$230 million for road construction, many more millions will be spent in South Jersey under the state's new bond issue program for other capital projects, including educational and institutional buildings.

A new state college to be constructed in Atlantic, Cape May or Cumberland counties will cost at least \$15 million. This is a bond issue law pledge, along with the statutory promise of another state college in North Jersey.

South Jersey also will benefit from the \$7.5 million to be spent for a statewide educational television and radio network.

Much of the \$30 million earmarked on the priority list for Rutgers University will go toward expansion of Rutgers of South Jersey, Camden. Part of the \$34 million for state college expansion will be spent on Glassboro State and an estimated half of the \$15 million for county colleges will be spent in the south.
