The new state college to be located in Bergen County is one step closer to realization with the swearing of trustees last night.

Superior Court Judge Theodore I. Botter administered the oath of office to Seymour Herr of Teaneck, Mrs. Florence Thomases of Englewood, Don E. Carter of Fort Lee, Robert Bickerton Clark of Morris Plains, Dickinson Debevoise of Short Hills, Mrs. Norma Jones of West Orange and William Mackay of Upper Montclair.

### Amarel Absent

Trustee Saul Amarel of Princeton was unable to attend the ceremony. A ninth trustee is still to be named by the State Board of Higher Education.

Herr is vice president of Bayonne Steel Products Co. and former president of the Teaneck Board of Education. Mrs. Thomases is an active member of the

Urban League and League of Women Voters and the United Nations Speakers' Research Committee. Carter is executive editor of The Record and The Morning Call and former managing editor of the National Observer.

Clark is executive vice president of Hoffman-LaRoche Pharmaceuticals and holds a law degree. Debevoise is a Newark attorney serving on the governor's Committee on Law and Order. Mrs. Jones is a former news reporter and case worker who served on the Franklin County, Ohio, Board of Education.

Mackay is director of personnel planning in the corporate services area of Prudential Insurance Co. He served on the governor's Commission to Evaluate Capital Needs of New Jersey. Amarel is director of the division of research in computer theory for RCA Laboratories, Princeton.

The brief ceremony took

place at the Freeholders Chamber of the County Administrative Building in Hackensack, following a two-hour executive session of the new board.

Attending were Freeholder Director Henry L. Hoebel and Freeholders Mrs. June Clark, Franklin H. Cooper, William J. Dorgan, and Anthony J. Statile, and county executive administrator Frank C. Osmer Jr. Dr. Richard E. Bjork, assis-

tant chancellor of higher education, and James Judy, staff member, represented the Department of Higher Education.

Clark, acting president of the board, said the group's first business is to find a president and a site for the college.

The new four-year state institution, along with another to be located in Atlantic County, was authorized with the passage of the bond issue last November.
